Mac Frampton

Mac Frampton is a graduate of Erskine College, in his home state of South Carolina; and The Cincinnati Conservatory, where he earned both his Master's and Doctoral degrees in Piano Performance. Recognition with a special medal at the world-famous Van Cliburn International Piano Competition followed, establishing Mac as a classical pianist with legitimate credentials. However, his love of the music of The Silver Screen and Broadway, coupled with his passion for jazz, led him back to his first love: performing pops concerts.

Over the past 38 years Mac Frampton has given over 3000 concerts across the USA, Canada, Europe, and the Orient. His success has spawned 28 recordings, numerous appearances with the world's leading orchestras, and a motion picture soundtrack. He is also a producer, with Cole Porter and George Gershwin revues to his credit. In addition to **That Mancini Magic!**, Mac currently has several productions touring nationally: **An American Portrait**, a tribute to the heroes of 9/11; **Pop Go The Classics**, featuring classical music with contemporary stylings; and **Yesterday Once More**, a look back at the romantic music of The Seventies. His **Hollywood Hills Orchestra** brings the music of The Silver Screen to audiences the world over. Mac and his wife Nancy live in Atlanta. They have two sons, both of whom are involved in the entertainment industry.

Cecil Welch

A native of Atlanta, Cecil graduated from Georgia Tech and was immediately chosen to be principal trumpet in the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. When Henry Mancini heard Cecil perform at one of his concerts, he hired Mr. Welch, and for the next two decades Cecil traveled the world with Mr. Mancini as his solo trumpeter, performing everywhere from The Hollywood Bowl to The London Philharmonic.

Mr. Welch has produced two notable recordings and is in constant demand as a soloist with orchestras and for audiences the world over.
